Abstract

These instructions provide guidelines for authors, preparing their final camera-ready papers for submission to the ECUMICT 2010 conference, and publication of those papers in the proceedings to be edited by Nevelland vzw (ISBN 9-78908082-550-5). Abstracts (maximum 200 words) should be self-explanatory and summarise the essential qualities of papers.

Keywords: *camera ready paper, fonts, tables, figures, equations.*

1 Introduction

Authors are invited to submit papers for publication in the proceedings of the ECUMICT 2010 conference as a pdf file or a \LaTeX dvi file. The dvi file is calculated with \LaTeX , using the ecumict10.tex file. Papers should be written in English and submitted in final camera ready form.

2 Paper and text format

2.1 Word-format

The MS Word document should be based on the ecumict10.dot file. The camera ready work should be exported in pdf-format.

Papers should be single-spaced on one side only of A4 pages. The margins will be: top 3.5 cm, bottom 2 cm, left and right 2.25 cm. The fonts to be used are listed in table 1¹. The text should be presented in a one-column format. The authors' names and affiliation should appear on separate lines and the mailing address should appear after the author to whom the correspondence will be addressed.

2.2 L^AT_EX-format

When using L^AT_EX the ecumict10.tex file should be used as a template. Either a dvi file or a pdf² file may be generated.

3 Tables, figures, equations

Illustrations and tables should be progressively numbered, following the order cited in the text. They should be accompanied by an explanatory text positioned at the top of the tables and at the bottom of the figures.

Formulae should be clearly written and well separated from the text. Each formula should occupy one line. Formulae have consecutive numbers, marked in brackets.

No references to page numbers should be made.

References to cited sources should be incorporated within the text (e.g. [1]) The bibliographical references should be placed at the end of the paper and should follow the model given below.
